AUGUST 10TH - IN BETWEEN (ISRAEL, 2016)

103 min

A witty and buoyant comedic drama about three independent young Palestinian women living in Tel Aviv struggling to find their way through Arab-Israeli culture, nightlife, and identity. Leila, a criminal lawyer from a bourgeois secular Muslim family, works during the day and parties at night. Her roommate Salma is a lesbian DJ from a "liberal" Christian family. When Nour, a pious Muslim girl, becomes their new roommate, things become even more complicated, bringing the three together as they find a way to survive with grace and humor.

SEPTEMBER 14TH - APRIL & THE EXTRAORDINARY WORLD (FRANCE, 2015)

105 min

In 1941, Napoleon V is the ruler of a France that's technologically behind the times but struggling to catch up. One by one, scientists are disappearing, including April's parents. April, left behind with her talking cat Darwin, searches for her parents, while carrying on their mission — to secretly create a serum that will make people immortal. Animated.

OCTOBER 12TH - LAND OF MINE (DENMARK, 2015)

100 min

In post-World War II Denmark, a group of young German POWs are forced to clear a beach of thousands of land mines under the watch of a Danish Sergeant who slowly learns to appreciate their plight. Inspired by real events, Land of Mine exposes the untold story of one tragic moment in postwar history.

NOVEMBER 9TH - JULIETA (SPAIN, 2016)

99 min

Twelve years after her teenage daughter Antia disappeared from her life, a chance meeting with a friend of Antia's from childhood prompts Julieta to abandon plans to move from Madrid to Portugal. It turns out that Antia is alive and well and living in Switzerland. However, Julieta now must come to terms with the past to embrace the future and a potential reunion
