Submission Guidelines

Deadline to submit all writing for the contest: September 18, 2021 (by 5:00 PM)

Poetry

Up to 3 submissions accepted

Must not exceed 2 pages (each)

Note: All contest winners will have up to 3 minutes to read their winning piece or an excerpt of their piece

Short Story (Fiction and Non-Fiction)

Up to 2 submissions accepted

Must not exceed 7 pages (each)

Note: All contest winners will have up to 5 minutes to read their winning piece or an excerpt of their piece

*All works submitted must be original by the author, and not previously published elsewhere.

Judging of Pieces

All submissions will be judged as blind entries – the names of the authors will be kept confidential until the preferred pieces are selected. All participants will be notified by email when the final decisions have been made. All judging decisions are final. *Participants will only be able to place once in each category (Poetry and Short Story). If scoring of multiple pieces rank to place, the highest-level prize for that participant will be awarded. Awards and prizes will be available for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each category and each age group.

Submission Guidelines

- Please keep in mind that this is a public event for all ages so submissions need to be appropriate
- ♦ Submissions are open to anyone age 13 and up
- You may submit to both categories
- All submissions must be in <u>size 12</u>, <u>Times New Roman font</u>, and have a title
- <u>Title</u> of work needs to be listed on every page with page numbers, if submission is more than one page in length
- Contact details (such as <u>first and last name</u>, <u>email</u>, and/or <u>phone number</u>) must be provided for each submission in the email, but <u>do not</u> include any identifying information in your submission
- ◆ The <u>category</u> (Poetry or Short Story) and <u>age group</u> (Youth—13 to 17 or Adult—18+) must also be included in your submission email
- ♦ <u>Each piece</u> must be submitted in an <u>individual document</u> (Word or PDF) by <u>email</u> to <u>writersday@cooshistory.org</u>
- ♦ Writing must be submitted by September 18, 2021 by 5:00 PM
